Treasurer's report: Beginning **\$2666.50:** \$137.50 postage, ending balance **\$2529.00.**

Public Officials: The city budget was passed. Overtime pay for police officers was a big issue. Money was allocated for the “**Cure Violence Program**” a national program to attack violence using a holistic approach. A **Criminal Justice Coordinating Council** has been created to assist this process. Lobbyist are now off the floor during board meetings but citizens can sit in the gallery without special permission. Construction has started on the **Nature Playscape** in Forest Park. Discussion is underway for developing zoning for the installation of medical marijuana dispensaries.

Old Business- A cease and desist order has been sent to the landlord concerning the problems on Bennet Ct.
