Brian Kolde NIS koldeb@stlouis-mo.gov – Brian discussed tornado cleanup and recommended Stlrecovers.com for more information on how to help. There was discussion on the ongoing problems with the house in the 6200 block of Marmaduke. Brian asked that more people in that block lodge complaints about that address to push the City Counselor into taking more action. The board will send a letter supporting action on this property. Anyone else with information is encouraged to contact the city with information specific to 6276 Marmaduke and problems you have encountered or seen.

Bret Narayan Alderman- narayanb@stl.mo.gov Narayan reported that a contractor has been hired to split the electricity from the comfort station so that the fountains will work in the pond. There is no ETA for when this happens. It has been sent to the board of Estimates and Appropriations for approval. There was discussion on the use and effectiveness of speed bumps, especially around the park. First responders and snowplow drivers don't like them and speeders don't pay attention to them. Rumble strips were suggested since they are cheaper and moveable. There was no final decision on this issue. The City's web site is a place to find out how traffic calming money is allocated and spent.

Nick Kimble, District 82 State Rep- Nick.Kimble@house.mo.gov 51 bills were truly passed including the city police takeover. This will create a board made up of the Chief of Police, the Mayor and two others approved by the Senate. Putting amendment 3 back on the ballot also passed.
